C. Closed Session Report Out.

Thomas A. Russell, General Counsel, announced that the Board considered items on the Closed Session Agenda. Mr. Russell stated that no reportable action was taken. E. Board Committee Reports.

Commissioner Urtasun reported the Maritime Stakeholder Forum was held on December 15, 2022. Commissioner Urtasun explained that the meetings consist of organizations where the attendees give different perspectives on the various initiatives that the Port is embarking upon. Commissioner Urtasun also shared that Crowley Marine gave a presentation on the all-electric tug project and its advancements.

F. Commissioners' Reports.

None.

G. Special Recognition.

Gina Jacobs, Business & Community Partner, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI), shared that on the third Monday of each January, the Port celebrates Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who was the first modern-day private citizen to be honored with a federal holiday for his accomplishments and inspiration in the civil rights movement. Ms. Jacobs then announced that January 22, 2023 is the Lunar New Year which is tied to the lunar calendar and began as a time for feasting and to honor household and heavenly deities, as well as ancestors. Ms. Jacobs also added that 2023 is the Year of the Rabbit which is thought to be a symbol of longevity, peace and prosperity. Lastly, Ms. Jacobs announced the passing of Michael Jablonski, a member of the Accessibility Advisory Committee who served from 2003-2021.

Mike LaFleur, Vice President, Maritime, recognized Bruce Cummings, Marine Terminal Supervisor, Maritime, as he retires after 32 1/2 years with the Port. Mr. La Fleur reported that Mr. Cummings received multiple service awards for his outstanding performances and shared some of his notable accomplishments.

H. President's Report.

Joe Stuyvesant, President/CEO, reported that staff and the Parks & Recreation Department conducted a workshop for street vendors and performers on December 20, 2022 in which more than 76 people attended. Mr. Stuyvesant stated that the purpose of the meeting was to review recent regulatory changes which have contributed to the existing vending conditions on the Port's waterfront. The next step in this initiative is to develop and draft an updated ordinance for consideration by the Board at the February Board Meeting.

Mr. Stuyvesant shared that the 2022 Port of San Diego Holiday Bowl Parade was held on Wednesday, December 28, 2022, where the Port is the title sponsor of this balloon parade that marched along Harbor Drive. Mr. Stuyvesant thanked all who contributed to the long-range planning and execution of this event.

Lastly, Mr. Stuyvesant announced that on January 13, 2023, the Port of San Diego and the Working Waterfront will be partnering with the San Diego & Imperial Community Colleges Regional Consortium by attending their Workforce Development Council (WDC) meeting. Representatives from the community colleges will learn more about opportunities for students to work at the Port of San Diego.

I. District Clerk's Announcements.

Donna Morales, District Clerk, announced that as required by the Brown Act and directed by the Board of Port Commissioners, there is an item on the agenda taking final action to amend the employment agreement for the General Counsel and the Auditor for the San Diego Unified Port District, that will modify their salaries. B. Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner A. Moore led the pledge of allegiance.

C. Closed Session Report Out.

Thomas A. Russell, General Counsel, announced that the Board considered items on the Closed Session Agenda. Mr. Russell stated that no reportable action was taken.

D. Public Communications.

The following member(s) of the public addressed the Board with non agenda-related comments: Brandt Smith, Jesse Garcia, and Christopher Allen.

E. Board Committee Reports.

No Board Committee Reports were provided.

F. Commissioners' Reports.

Commissioner Naranjo provided a report on the Transportation Committee of the San Diego Association of Governments which met on February 3, 2023. Commissioner Naranjo shared that the agenda included: Planning for the realignment of rail tracks away from the Del Mar Bluffs to a more stable site east; continuation of planning and study on the best site to construct a Mobility Hub; reviewing plans for a new Purple Line trolley; completion of the Otay Mesa East Port of Entry; exploring ways to continue the successful Youth Opportunity Pass Program; and implementation of the Vision Zero Action Plan.

Commissioner Naranjo then reported on the Portside Community Steering Committee which met virtually on January 24, 2023. Commissioner Naranjo announced that the following items were discussed: The San Diego Air Pollution Control District (APCD) announced the availability of \$4 million in funding for a Zero Emission Truck Pilot Program; and review of the Portside Community Steering Committee Charter and Voting Protocols. Commissioner Naranjo also shared that APCD staff provided an update on air quality monitoring in the Portside Community and that staff are conducting one-on-one interviews with committee members to receive feedback on the steering committee and improvements which can be made.

Commissioner Malcolm reported that he and Commissioner Naranjo attended the Association of Pacific Ports (APP) conference in Hawaii, the first since Covid, and that it was a chance to catch up with Ports and learn about their experiences dealing with Covid and overcoming problems. Commissioner Malcolm added he was able to share the Port's lessons learned as well. Commissioner Malcolm stated that there was a great line-up of speakers including a presentation where the Port's EConcrete project was featured prominently. Commissioner Naranjo added that the conference ended with a tour of Pier 51 terminal and the, not yet opened, Kapalama Container Terminal (KCT). Commissioner Naranjo reported that the US Department of Transportation awarded 47.3 million of the Port Infrastructure Development Program funds to fund the development of KCT green which would increase efficiency, safety of goods movement to and from the Hawaiian islands and reduce emissions and environmental impact of Port cargo handling operations. Commissioner Naranjo also said that the project is under a Master Project Labor Agreement.

G. Special Recognition

BPC Policy 250 - Service Recognition Program, allows employees that have achieved 15 or more years of service to be recognized during a Board meeting.

The following staff were recognized for their tenure: Janet Graham, Document Management Associate, Office of the District Clerk - 15 years of service; Stephanie Bauer, Program Manager, Planning & Environment - Environmental Protection - 15 years of service; and Maby Smith, Executive Assistant I, Engineering-Construction - 20 years of service.

Gina Jacobs, Business & Community Partner, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI), announced that February is Black History Month and the national theme this year is Black Resistance: A Journey to Equality. Ms. Jacobs shared that Port staff will celebrate Black History Month on February 24th, 2023, with a performance from the Martin Luther King Jr. Community Choir and food from small local black businesses.

H. President's Report.

Joe Stuyvesant, President/CEO, announced that the California Coastal Commission approved a Coastal Development Permit for the Port of San Diego and USS Midway Museum's proposed "Freedom Park" on Navy Pier. The park connects with the adjacent park areas that also reflect San Diego's military to create the largest veteran's park on the west coast. Mr. Stuyvesant thanked all who contributed to this project including Christopher Neils, Chair of USS Midway Museum Board of Directors, who thanked the Port of San Diego for their leadership, collaboration and contribution on the project.

Mr. Stuyvesant then shared that the southern California Ports, the California Department of Transportation, and the Union Pacific and Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Railroads for the Supporting Environmental and Community Advancement and National Security (SEACANS) project, which will focus on a regional approach to infrastructure needs for freight movement corridors.

Mr. Stuyvesant also shared he and staff will attend the annual California Ports Day in Sacramento on February 15th, 2023, with the primary objectives to raise awareness of the work ports do in their communities and their contributions to the State of California as well as to discuss issues with policymakers and collaborate on shared priorities.

Finally, Mr. Stuyvesant announced that the Compass Award, a perpetual award, which was created during the Port's 50 Anniversary is being passed to Shirley Parsons, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Manager, as the longest serving current employee in honor of her 33 years of service. Ms. Parsons began as an Office Assistant in 1989 and was promoted to seven other positions. ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE

From time to time, San Diego Unified Port District (we, us or Company) may be required by law to provide to you certain written notices or disclosures. Described below are the terms and conditions for providing to you such notices and disclosures electronically through the DocuSign system. Please read the information below carefully and thoroughly, and if you can access this information electronically to your satisfaction and agree to this Electronic Record and Signature Disclosure (ERSD), please confirm your agreement by selecting the check-box next to 'I agree to use electronic records and signatures' before clicking 'CONTINUE' within the DocuSign system.

Getting paper copies

At any time, you may request from us a paper copy of any record provided or made available electronically to you by us. You will have the ability to download and print documents we send to you through the DocuSign system during and immediately after the signing session and, if you elect to create a DocuSign account, you may access the documents for a limited period of time (usually 30 days) after such documents are first sent to you. After such time, if you wish for us to send you paper copies of any such documents from our office to you, you will be charged a \$0.00 per-page fee. You may request delivery of such paper copies from us by following the procedure described below.

Withdrawing your consent

If you decide to receive notices and disclosures from us electronically, you may at any time change your mind and tell us that thereafter you want to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format. How you must inform us of your decision to receive future notices and disclosure in paper format and withdraw your consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically is described below.

Consequences of changing your mind

If you elect to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format, it will slow the speed at which we can complete certain steps in transactions with you and delivering services to you because we will need first to send the required notices or disclosures to you in paper format, and then wait until we receive back from you your acknowledgment of your receipt of such paper notices or disclosures. Further, you will no longer be able to use the DocuSign system to receive required notices and consents electronically from us or to sign electronically documents from us.

All notices and disclosures will be sent to you electronically

Unless you tell us otherwise in accordance with the procedures described herein, we will provide electronically to you through the DocuSign system all required notices, disclosures, authorizations, acknowledgements, and other documents that are required to be provided or made available to you during the course of our relationship with you. To reduce the chance of you inadvertently not receiving any notice or disclosure, we prefer to provide all of the required notices and disclosures to you by the same method and to the same address that you have given us. Thus, you can receive all the disclosures and notices electronically or in paper format through the paper mail delivery system. If you do not agree with this process, please let us know as described below. Please also see the paragraph immediately above that describes the consequences of your electing not to receive delivery of the notices and disclosures electronically from us.

How to contact San Diego Unified Port District:

You may contact us to let us know of your changes as to how we may contact you electronically, to request paper copies of certain information from us, and to withdraw your prior consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically as follows:

We do not require any other information from you to change your email address.

If you created a DocuSign account, you may update it with your new email address through your account preferences.

To request paper copies from San Diego Unified Port District

To request delivery from us of paper copies of the notices and disclosures previously provided by us to you electronically, you must send us an email

to customerservicecenter@portofsandiego.org and in the body of such request you must state your email address, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. We will bill you for any fees at that time, if any.

To withdraw your consent with San Diego Unified Port District

To inform us that you no longer wish to receive future notices and disclosures in electronic format you may:

i. decline to sign a document from within your signing session, and on the subsequent page, select the check-box indicating you wish to withdraw your consent, or you may;

ii. send us an email to customerservicecenter@portofsandiego.org and in the body of such request you must state your email, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. We do not need any other information from you to withdraw consent.. The consequences of your withdrawing consent for online documents will be that transactions may take a longer time to process..

Required hardware and software

Acknowledging your access and consent to receive and sign documents electronically
