ORDINANCE 2835

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SAN DIEGO UNIFIED PORT DISTRICT, PORT OF SAN DIEGO TARIFF NO. 1-G, RATES AND CHARGES, TO INCREASE CERTAIN RATES AND UPDATE TARIFF FORMAT AND LANGUAGE

WHEREAS, the San Diego Unified Port District (District) is a public corporation created by the Legislature in 1962 pursuant to Harbors and Navigation Code Appendix I (Port Act); and

WHEREAS, District staff conducts an annual review of the San Diego Unified Port District (Port) Tariff No. 1-G (Tariff), which governs the rates, charges, rules and regulations applicable for all maritime-related commercial activity within the Port's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, District staff recommended that the Board adopt an amendment to the Port's Tariff, for a General Rate Increase (GRI), language revisions to amend the Tariff to include a new item for Cruise Passenger Operations Pier and Terminal Rental Fee, and other minor language modifications; and

WHEREAS, District staff recommended that the proposed rate increases would aid in balancing the rising costs of maintenance and infrastructure associated with maritime operations while maintaining a rate structure that is comparable to competitor ports; and

WHEREAS, the Board conducted a public hearing on the proposed changes on October 6, 2105.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Tariff No. 1-G, posted on the website for the San Diego Unified Port District at www.portofsandiego.org (Organization No. 011576 Tariff No. 1-G), is hereby amended as follows, effective December 1, 2015:

- a one and eight-tenths of a percent (1.8%) increase in General for Minimum Charge - Item No. 0510, Cargo Handling Permit Fee - Item No. 0515, Vessel Repair Permit Fee - Item No. 0520, and Hazardous and Dangerous Cargo Permit Fee - Item No. 0522;

- a one and eight-tenths of a percent (1.8%) increase in Dockage Charge for Transient Vessels – Item No. 0572(A), and Rates for Full Dockage – Item No. 0575(A);
- a one and eight-tenths of a percent (1.8%) increase in Wharfage for all other commodities, and Hawaiian Trade - Item No. 0666(A);
- a one and eight-tenths of a percent (1.8%) increase in Demurrage Rates – Item No. 0705(A), Storage Rates – Item No. 0720(A), Per Container Wharf Storage Rates – Item No. 0725, Space Occupancy Rates – Item No. 0735(A), Temporary Office Occupancy – Item No. 0736, and Temporary Area Assignments – Item No. 0737(A);
- a one and eight-tenths of a percent (1.8%) increase in Miscellaneous for Mobile Harbor Crane – Item No. 0738(I), Electrical Service for Refrigerated Containers - Item No. 0747(A), Electrical Service for Shore Power - Item No. 0748, Redelivery of Merchandise – Item No. 0750(A), and Environmental Surcharge – Dry Bulk – Item No. 0758;
- a two and eight-tenths of a percent (2.8%) increase in Wharfage for Vehicles – Item Nos. 0660(A), 0662(A), 0663(A), and 0664(A), and Storage Rates for Vehicles - Item No. 0720(A);
- Include a new item and add language for the following:
 - Item No. 0735(A)– Cruise Passenger Operations Pier and Terminal Rental Fee and added Tariff language as follows:

Cruise vessel operators using the B Street or Broadway Piers for passenger and/or baggage operations while no vessel is or is intended to be at berth on that same day will be assessed a fee of \$1,420 per day for such usages as a Pier and Terminal Rental Fee. Waiving of this fee is at the discretion of the Executive Director or authorized designee.
 - Other minor language modifications.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 31st day from its passage by the Board of Port Commissioners.




