## ORDINANCE <u>2883</u>

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FY 16/17 BUDGET INCREASING THE FY 16/17 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS BY \$200,000 TO BE FUNDED FROM THE FY 15/16 UNRESTRICTED RESOURCES FOR PLANNED FY 16/17 EXPENDITURES ON THE DEMOLITION AND SITE IMPROVEMENTS OF TRANSIT SHEDS 1 AND 2 AT TENTH AVENUE MARINE TERMINAL PROJECT

WHEREAS, the San Diego Unified Port District (District) is a public corporation created by the legislature in 1962 pursuant to Harbors and Navigation Code Appendix 1 (Port Act); and

WHEREAS, in anticipation of increased freight volumes at Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal (TAMT) the District identified short-term and long-term objectives for physical improvements at TAMT that would facilitate the increase; and

WHEREAS, the District was awarded a \$10M U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) TIGER Grant for renovations of TAMT; and

WHEREAS, as part of the TAMT redevelopment, the Board approved a new Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project titled, Demolition and Site Improvements of Transit Sheds 1 and 2 at Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal (New CIP Project), budgeted at \$23M; with \$10M funded by the TIGER Grant, and \$13M funded by the District; and

WHEREAS, to initiate this New CIP Project, \$200,000 in District funding is needed to fund design completion of the initial phase this Fiscal Year, scheduled to be completed by spring 2017; and

**WHEREAS**, staff is proposing to increase the District's FY 16/17 amended budget, CIP Appropriation, by \$200,000 to be funded from the FY 15/16 Unrestricted Resources for planned FY 16/17 expenditures for ongoing design of the New CIP Project through the end of this fiscal year.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Fiscal Year 2016/2017 amended budget, CIP Appropriation, is increased by \$200,000 to be funded from the Fiscal Year

2015/2016 Unrestricted Resources for planned Fiscal Year 2016/2017 expenditures for ongoing design of the New CIP Project through the end of Fiscal Year 2016/2017.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 31<sup>st</sup> day from its passage by the Board of Port Commissioners.
