RESOLUTION AMENDING BPC POLICY NO. 120, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, TO REMOVE MARITIME TERMINAL IMPACT FUND PROVISIONS, AND ADOPTION OF BOARD POLICY NO. 773 TO ESTABLISH A MARITIME INDUSTRIAL IMPACT FUND POLICY

WHEREAS, the San Diego Unified Port District (District) is a public corporation created by the legislature in 1962 pursuant to Harbors and Navigation Code Appendix 1, (Port Act); and

WHEREAS, in December, 2010, the Board of Port Commissioners (BPC) amended BPC Policy No. 120, Capital Improvement Program, to establish a Maritime Terminal Impact Fund (MTIF) to be used to fund projects that mitigate off-tidelands impacts from on-tidelands activities; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to better utilize MTIF funds, a stand-alone MTIF policy was drafted with input from multiple stakeholders, including the cities of San Diego and National City, the Environmental Health Coalition, the Port Tenants Association, and the Environmental Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends amendment of BPC Policy No. 120 to remove MTIF provisions and adopt a new stand-alone MTIF policy, BPC Policy No. 773.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District hereby renames the MTIF as the Maritime Industrial Impact Fund and amends BPC Policy No. 120 to remove Maritime Terminal Impact Fund provisions, a copy of which is on file with the Office of the District Clerk, and adopts a new Maritime Industrial Impact Fund, BPC Policy No. 773, a copy of which is on file with the Office of the District Clerk.
