RESOLUTION <u>2016-130</u>

RESOLUTION AMENDING BPC POLICY NO. 608: TENANT PERCENT FOR ART TO INCORPORATE ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATES AND NON-SUBSTANTIVE POLICY CHANGES

- WHEREAS, the San Diego Unified Port District (District) is a public corporation created by the legislature in 1962 pursuant to Harbors and Navigation Code Appendix 1, (Port Act); and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Port Commissioners (BPC) adopted BPC Policy No. 608 to establish a policy for the inclusion of artworks in San Diego Unified Port District tenant improvements; and
- WHEREAS, in 2002, the District established and adopted its first one percent (1%) for art requirement for the inclusion of artwork in tenant improvement projects; and
- WHEREAS, at the time of its adoption, the requirement applied to tenant improvement projects with approved budgets of \$500,000 or more; and
- WHEREAS, since its inception, over 40 tenant artworks have been installed or are currently projected for installation on tidelands as part of the tenant percent for art program; and
- **WHEREAS**, on May 4, 2010, the BPC adopted the Public Art Master Plan, which outlined a new strategic plan based on best practices and national standards in public arts administration; and
- WHEREAS, after the adoption of the Public Art Master Plan, staff began evaluating the accuracy and effectiveness of the District's existing public artrelated policies and identifying the necessary revisions to bring these art policies in alignment with the Public Art Master Plan; and
- WHEREAS, on November 8, 2011, the BPC adopted BPC Policy No. 608 as a stand-alone policy to govern the tenant percent for art program, which had previously been administered in accordance with provisions contained in BPC Policy No. 609: Public Art; and
- WHEREAS, one of the key changes embodied in the newly adopted policy was an increase in the tenant percent for art applicability threshold from a minimum of \$500,000 to \$1 million per tenant improvement project, in order to provide for more substantial tenant art budgets; and

WHEREAS, on April 14, 2015, BPC Policy No. 608 was again revised to incorporate feedback from Port District tenants, the Public Art Committee, and staff; and

WHEREAS, this revision raised the threshold for the percent for art requirement from \$1 million to \$5 million and streamlined the approval process for tenants, making it a stronger and more effective policy for the District; and

WHEREAS, on May 10, 2016, the policy underwent another revision specifically to provide tenants with an option to designate their percent for art contributions for the District's San Diego-Coronado Bay Bridge Lighting Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District, as follows:

That the Executive Director or her designated representative is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the San Diego Unified Port District to amend BPC Policy No. 608: Tenant Percent for Art to incorporate administrative updates and non-substantive policy changes.
