## RESOLUTION 2016-39

**RESOLUTION SELECTING AND AUTHORIZING A** THREE-PARTY AGREEMENT WITH ASPEN **ENVIRONMENTAL** GROUP FOR ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW CONSULTING SERVICES FOR THE MITSUBISHI CEMENT **CORPORATION WAREHOUSE C – BULK CEMENT** WAREHOUSE AND LOADING FACILITY PROJECT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$318,000 FOR A PERIOD OF 24 MONTHS

**WHEREAS**, the San Diego Unified Port District (District) is a public corporation created by the Legislature in 1962 pursuant to Harbors and Navigation Code Appendix I (Port Act); and

**WHEREAS**, Section 21 of the Port Act states that the District Board of Port Commissioners (BPC) may pass all necessary ordinances and resolutions for the regulation of the District; and

**WHEREAS,** the BPC has adopted BPC Policy No. 110 establishing a procedure for the administration of contracts and the purchasing of supplies, materials, and equipment, and establishing a policy governing the processing and administration of contracts; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2015, the BPC granted a Conditional Agreement with a term sheet to Mitsubishi Cement Corporation (MCC) to facilitate project submittal and review for a proposed cement importation terminal at the District's Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal (TAMT); and

**WHEREAS**, in September 2015, MCC submitted the Mitsubishi Cement Corporation at Warehouse C – Bulk Cement Warehouse and Loading Facility (Project), which proposes improvements to Warehouse C at the TAMT to support the import and distribution of cement throughout San Diego County (County); and

**WHEREAS**, the Development Services team within the District's Real Estate Development Department (Development Services) maintains a list of qualified consultants for the preparation of environmental review documents and technical studies for these projects consistent with BPC Policy No. 110; and

WHEREAS, from this list, Development Services has selected Aspen Environmental Group (Aspen) to prepare an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) under CEQA for the Project and has recommended entering into a three-party agreement with Aspen and MCC, whereby MCC will be solely responsible for the 2016-39

costs of retaining Aspen, and Aspen will perform the required services under the direction of the District; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with BPC Policy No. 106, MCC will be responsible for staff costs to process the EIR.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District, as follows:

That the Executive Director or her authorized designee is hereby authorized on behalf of the San Diego Unified Port District to enter into a threeparty agreement with Aspen Environmental Group for Environmental Review Consulting Services for the Mitsubishi Cement Corporation Warehouse C – Bulk Cement Warehouse and Loading Facility Project in an amount not to exceed \$318,000 for a period of 24 months.
