## **RESOLUTION 2017-156**

RESOLUTION SELECTING AND AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH WSP USA, INC. FOR THE HARBOR DRIVE MULTIMODAL CORRIDOR STUDY (BETWEEN THE TENTH AVENUE MARINE TERMINAL AND NATIONAL CITY MARINE TERMINAL) FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$474,000

**WHEREAS**, the San Diego Unified Port District (District) is a public corporation created by the Legislature in 1962 pursuant to Harbors and Navigation Code Appendix I; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Port Commissioners (BPC) adopted BPC Policy No. 110 to establish a policy governing the processing and administration of public projects, consulting and service agreements, the purchasing of supplies, materials and equipment, and grants; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2013, the District began a comprehensive, integrated planning process that will result in a 50-year vision for the District, which will be used to inform the Port Master Plan Update; and

**WHEREAS**, the District has completed development of the Vision and Guiding Principles portion of the integrated planning process, which resulted in the identification of high-priority concepts that deserve additional study and planning; and

**WHEREAS**, a conceptual "Haul Road" was identified as a high-priority concept that deserves additional study and consideration as a project that could generate regional benefit and serve multiple constituencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the construction of a new, fully segregated truck-only road along San Diego's Working Waterfront is unlikely, staff is proposing to advance a "Harbor Drive Multimodal Corridor Study," with the intention of developing a suite of projects and operational improvements that can be implemented over time; and

**WHEREAS**, when completed, this study will identify goals for the various uses of Harbor Drive between the Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal and the National City Marine Terminal, as well as a suite of operational and infrastructure improvement projects that can achieve those goals; and

**WHEREAS**, the District released a Request for Qualifications 17-49SN in August 2017; and

WHEREAS, five proposals were received; and

**WHEREAS**, the District received responsive proposals from KOA Corporation, CJ Roberts Inc., Chen Ryan Associates Inc., and WSP USA, Inc. (WSP); and

**WHEREAS**, a panel comprised of staff and outside stakeholders interviewed KOA Corporation, CJ Roberts Inc., and WSP as part of the selection process; and

**WHEREAS**, due to the level of expertise, experience, and clear approach to the project demonstrated by WSP, staff recommends the BPC select and authorize an agreement with WSP for the Harbor Drive Multimodal Corridor Study, between Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal and National City Marine Terminal, for an amount not to exceed \$474,000.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Port Commissioners of the San Diego Unified Port District, as follows:

That the Executive Director or her designated representative is hereby authorized on behalf of the San Diego Unified Port District to select and enter into an agreement with WSP USA, Inc. for the Harbor Drive Multimodal Corridor Study, between Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal and National City Marine Terminal, for an amount not to exceed \$474,000.
