Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: The proposed project would involve the removal and replacement of the existing roof at Crow's Nest Marine Inc. (Applicant) in the city of San Diego, California. The purpose of the project is to remove and replace the existing 1,375-square-foot-roof due to its current damaged and dry-rotted state. Prior to the removal of the existing roof, all nearby grounds would be tarped and covered to protect from construction-related activities. The existing roof would then be removed down to the underlying wood substrate to allow for the inspection of the roof deck for any damaged or dry-rotted wood to be replaced as necessary. Components of the new roof would consist of engineered wood panels, a synthetic underlayment, ice and water shield membrane, low-profile vents, and new roof shingles.

Construction for the proposed project is anticipated to commence sometime around August 2024, with an anticipated duration of approximately seven (7) days to complete. The proposed project would require the use of a dump truck for storing and hauling demolition materials and debris, which would be parked on-site at the existing parking lot on-site within the Applicant's leasehold, along with associated construction personnel vehicles. Roof removal, installations, finishing, and cleanup would require a crew of approximately five (5) personnel.

Due to its temporary nature and limited scope, the proposed project would generate a minor amount of vehicle trips and would require limited use of equipment. Therefore, impacts related to air quality, greenhouse gas emissions, and transportation and traffic are not anticipated to occur. Furthermore, the Applicant would be responsible for complying with all applicable federal, state, and local laws regarding construction demolition debris, hazards and hazardous materials, and stormwater.

roof that would involve negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing, would be located on the same site as the structure replaced, and would have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure being replaced. Section 3.a. and 3.b. of the District's CEQA Guidelines are as follows:

- 3.a. Existing Facilities (SG § 15301) (Class 1): Includes operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing, including but not limited to:
 - (3) Interior and exterior remodeling or alterations, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that previously existing, including, but not limited to, marine terminal facilities, and marine-oriented commercial, industrial, and public and commercial recreational facilities, including buildings, piers, wharves, marine ways; railroads; airport facilities, runways, taxiways, aprons, and ancillary structures to those facilities; or mechanical systems and equipment.
