Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: The proposed project consists of an amendment to the Coastal Act Categorical Determination of Exclusion (Project No. 2025-047) for the Maintenance Dredging at B Street Cruise Ship Terminal (Project or proposed Project) to update the quantity of material to be dredged from 26,000 to 34,000 cubic yards (cy). The dredge area (-33 ft at the 100 ft mark off the quay wall and -29 ft at the 65 ft mark, with appropriate grading in between), has been revised to ensure the new shore power infrastructure can be used safely and effectively by all incoming vessels. The revised slope angle provides greater structural stability to the quay wall, reduces the risk of soil sloughing, and improves vessel clearance during berthing operations. Together, the added dredge area and gentler slope enhance both the safety and usability of the pier.

The B Street Pier Cruise Ship Terminal is located in north San Diego Bay along the eastern shoreline; dredging activities would occur on the north and south sides of the pier and at the northwest and southwest corners. Maintenance/knockdown dredging activities are needed due to cruise ships moving into and out of the berths causing scour pits and high spots, reducing the berth depth to -28' Mean Lower Low Water (MLLW). The proposed project will remove accumulated sediments to -33' MLLW, by moving an estimated 34,000 cy of material from high spots which will then be placed into adjacent scour pits nearby, increasing navigational safety for cruise ships. The original navigational design depth of the B Street Pier Cruise Ship Terminal is -37' MLLW.

In the knockdown areas to be dredged, all materials shall be removed and disposed of in adjacent scour pits abutting the dredge area by means of side casting the dredge material. Temporary staging of material may be required to effectively move dredged material to the adjacent scour pits. The areas to be dredged are indicated in Exhibit A1 and Exhibit A2 and include areas where materials will be removed (dredged) and scour pits or receiving areas where the material will be deposited. The berths shall be dredged to -33' (MLLW) plus 2' of overdredge. The scour pits will be filled no higher than to -33' (MLLW). Debris not suitable to be used as fill shall be removed from the site and properly disposed of and/or recycled, if possible. Both pre- and post-dredging surveys and post-dredge volume calculations will be performed. The use of a silt curtain, visual monitoring for turbidity outside the silt curtain and species of concern will occur during construction phases using heavy equipment. No pile driving is included with the proposed project.

Dredging would occur with use of a Clamshell bucket or similar equipment, deployed from a barge; seabed leveling may require use of a grading beam to smooth high-spots as needed after dredging. The high spots or shoal, and scour pits dredging will be conducted to minimize the re-suspension of sediment.

The contractor will be required to prepare and submit to the Port and other regulatory agencies for review and approval the following Plans to ensure the safe and timely completion of dredging activities:

- Dredging Operations Plan;
- Solid Debris Management Plan;

- Quality Control Plan for dredging operations;
- Waterway Control Plan(s) including notification to the Maritime Community.

Construction is anticipated to require up to eight weeks to complete construction activities and would occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
