



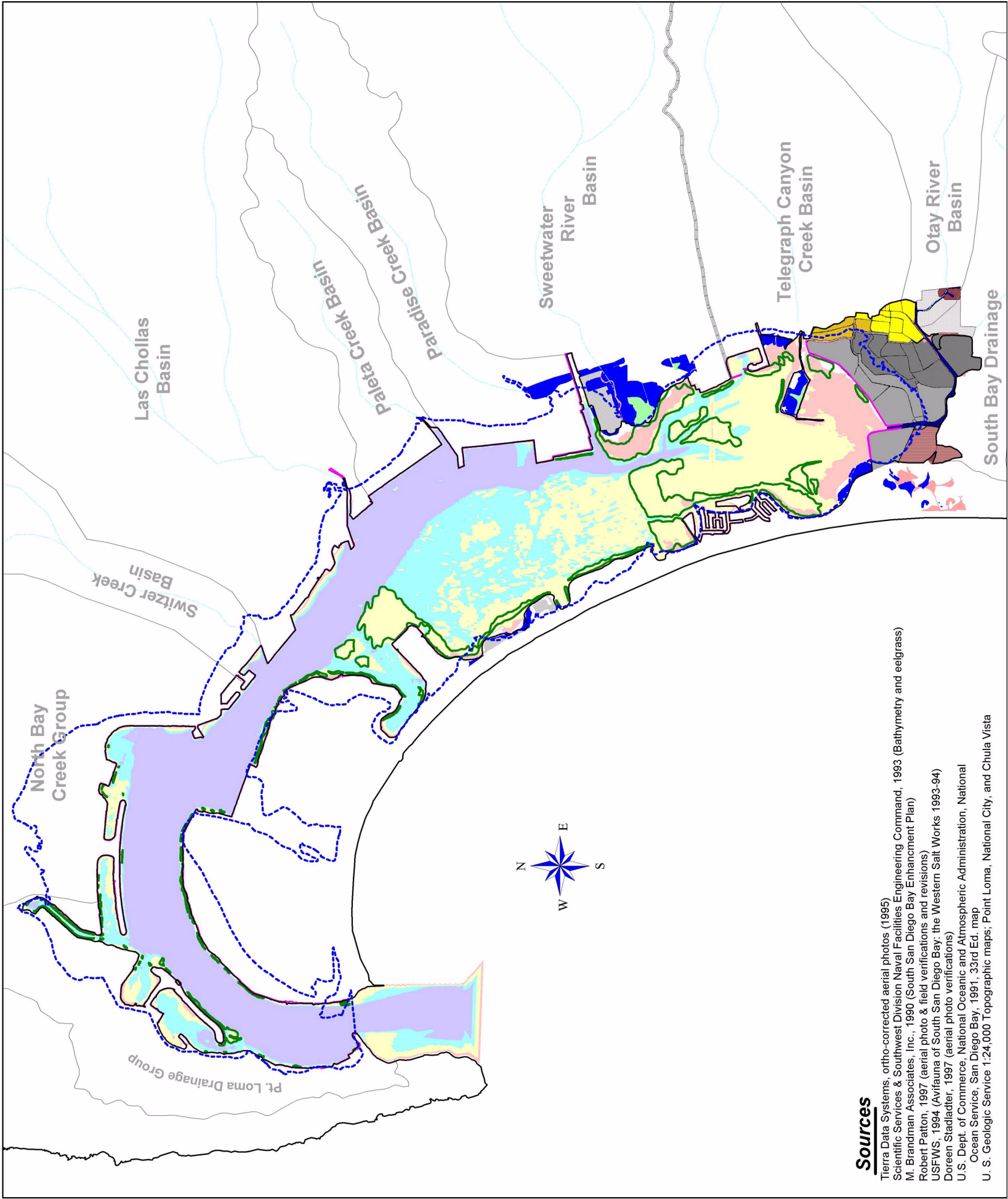
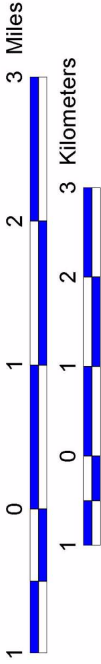

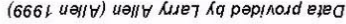

Map C-1. Habitats of San Diego Bay.

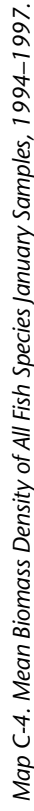




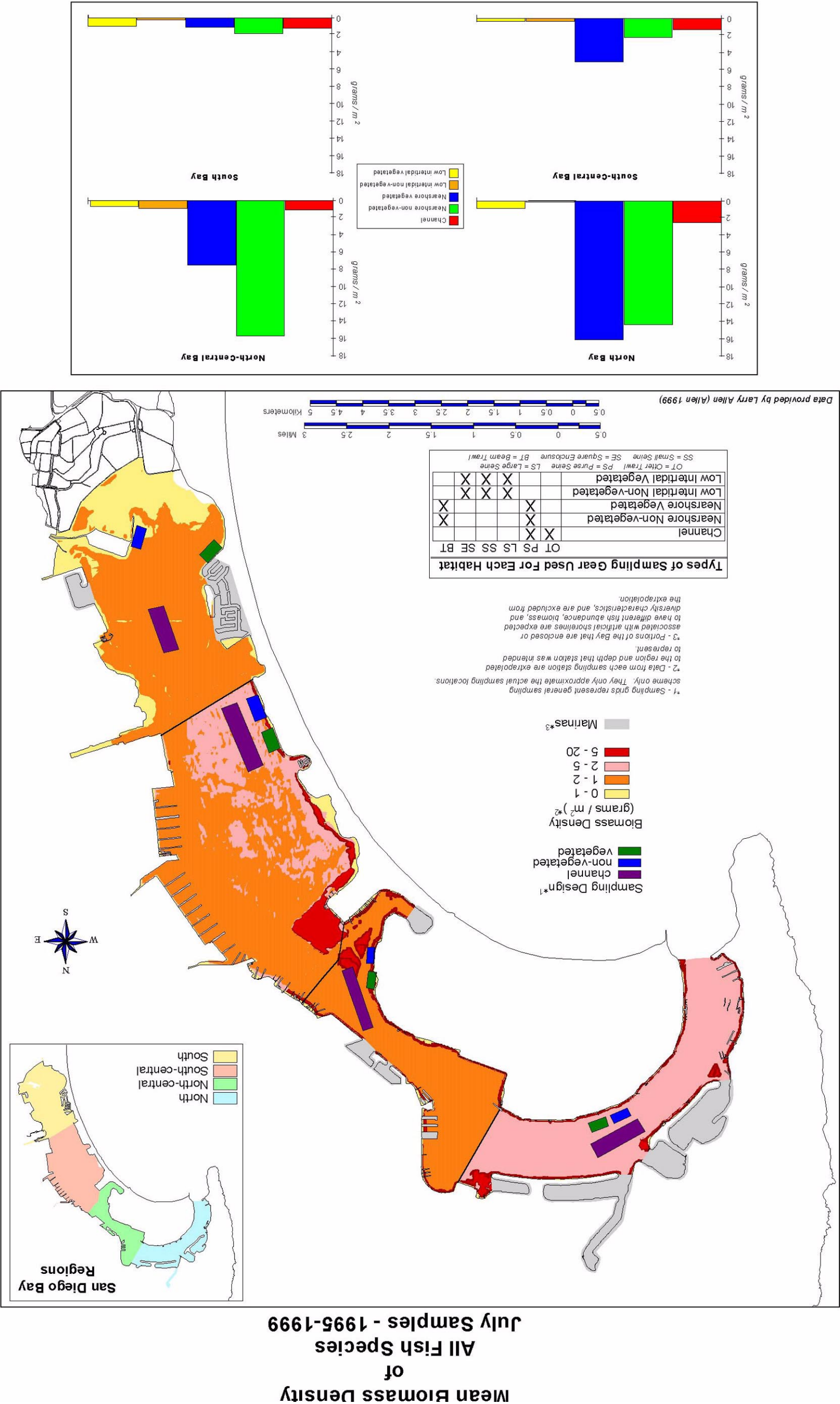






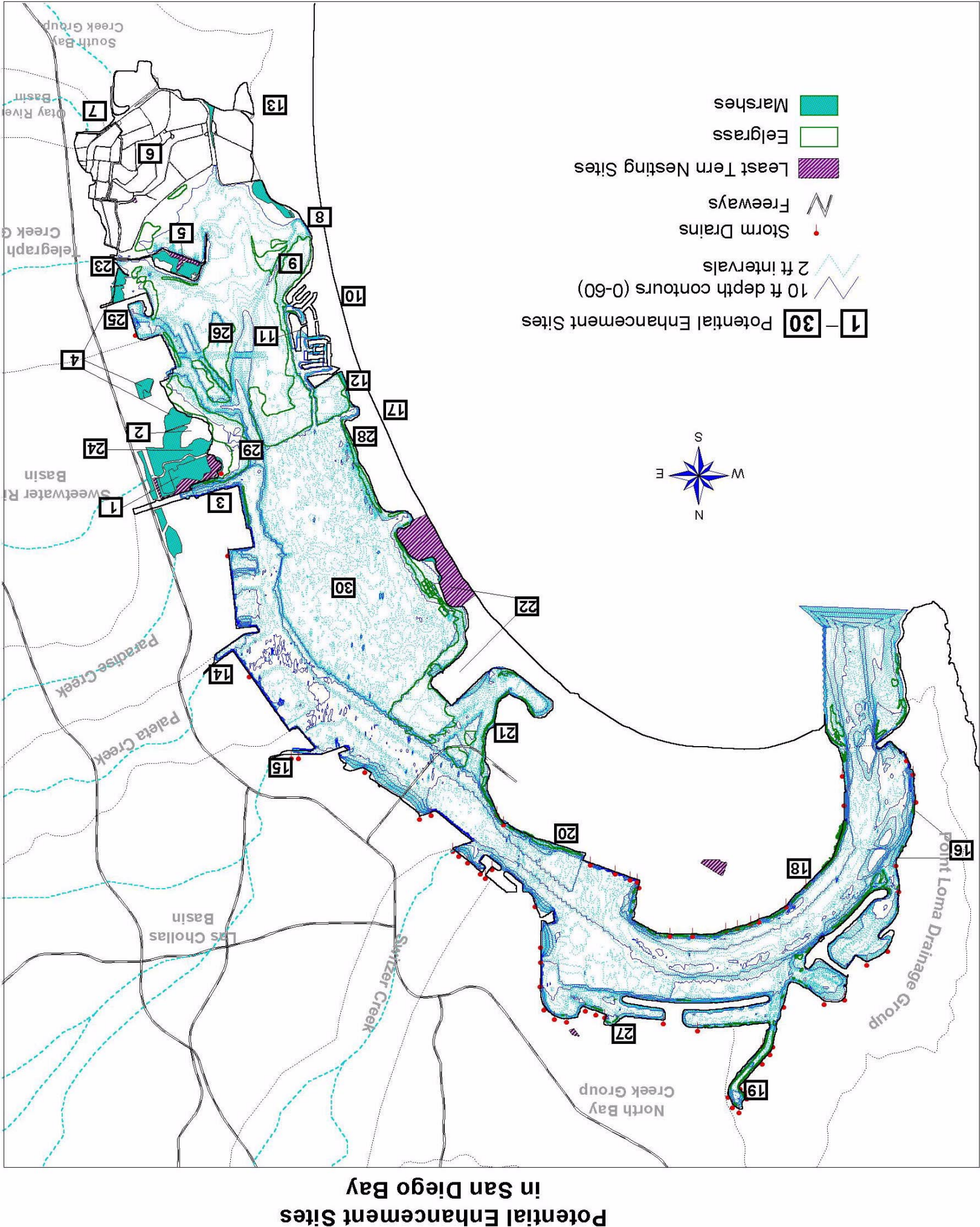






Map C-5. Mean Biomass Density of All Fish Species July Samples, 1994–1997.
