
















California Coastal Commission

- Amended Coastal Act to include sections 30301(f) and 30604(h) pursuant to AB 2616
 - Commission required to include one member that resides in and works directly with disproportionately burdened communities in the state
 - Agencies authorized to consider environmental justice when taking actions on CDPs
- Draft Environmental Justice Policy Statement (2018)
 - Intended to ensure low-cost coastal access and recreational opportunities for all
 - District Staff participated in agency-level Draft Environmental Justice Policy Statement discussions throughout 2018

November 7, 2018: Public review comment period





State Lands Commission

- Draft Environmental Justice Policy (2018)
 - All communities equitably share in the environmental benefits and burdens
 - District Staff provided public comment on the Draft Environmental Justice Policy at State Land Commission board meetings and participated in agency led roundtable discussions from June through October 2018

December 3, 2018: Anticipated adoption of Final Environmental Justice Policy





California Air Resources Board

AB 617 Nonvehicular air pollution: criteria air pollutants and toxic air contaminants (2017)

- Requires the state board to develop a uniform statewide system of annual reporting of emissions of criteria air pollutants and toxic air contaminants for use by certain categories of stationary sources
- District Staff participating on steering committee focusing on additional air quality monitoring in Portside communities

July 1, 2019: Target date for completing installation of monitoring equipment as guided by steering committee



Integrated Planning Guiding Principle

BPC 725 – Transition Zone Policy

Protect maritime industrial lands and provide a transition to adjoining residential areas by establishing general guidelines to encourage the creation of transition zones between industrial lands and residential neighborhoods

Applied Action Example: Public Health

Climate Action Plan

- The Port of San Diego was one of the first ports in the nation to adopt a Climate Action Plan
- Includes goals to reduce greenhouse gas emissions relative to a 2006 baseline by 10% by 2020 and 25% by 2035





EJ Policy Concept #1: Public Access

Encourage integration of roadway and walkway systems connecting upland and disadvantaged communities to improve Baywide and local coastal access









EJ Policy Concept #2: Public Access

Require all coastal accessways, docks, piers, pedestrian facilities, and Recreation Open Space areas to be open to the public with consideration of public safety and resource protection constraints









EJ Policy Concept #3: Public Access

Encourage, and provide for, a range of lower-cost visitor serving waterside and water-oriented recreational facilities that provide an opportunity for the public to touch and interact with the water





Work with potential lessees early in the planning process to develop projects that will reduce impacts and provide benefits to disadvantaged communities





- Diverse visitor and student education provided by several Port tenants like the Midway Museum, the Maritime Museum, and Hornblower










